The Triangle Trust 1949 Fund

The Triangle Trust provides funding through its Development Grants programme twice a year to registered charities, not-for-profit social enterprises and community interest companies in the UK whose primary purpose is to support unpaid carers (spring round) and the rehabilitation of offenders or ex-offenders (autumn round). Development Grants provide funds towards any costs incurred by the applicant in undertaking its core business so that sustainable income sources can be developed and the organisation's income will not be reduced when the grant comes to an end. Grants are available for up to **£80,000** over three years with a maximum of £35,000 in year one.

Social Entrepreneurs Programme 2017-18

The Social Entrepreneurs Programme offers a free learning programme to support start up social enterprises or those who want to scale up their projects. To date, the programme has supported 1,300 social entrepreneurs with plans to support another 260 in 2017/18.

The programme offers the following strands:

- **Start Up** – Grants of up to £3,000 for projects in the planning stages, but ready to start or less than two years old. The project income should be between £0 and £14,999. This programme will support personal development and business skills development to help turn projects or project ideas into a reality.
- **Trade Up** - Grants of up to £5,000 for projects established at least one year ago and have at least one paid member of staff. The project income should be more than £15,000 a year. This strand is for those who are planning to grow and increase their trading income.
- **Scale Up** - Grants of up to £10,000 for established organisations with projects established two or more years ago and with two or more paid staff. The project income should be more than £75,000. This strand is for those that are looking to take their operations to the next level. This programme will equip applicants with the tools to develop their enterprise further and maximise its social impact.


The D'Oyly Carte Charitable Trust – Deadline: 19th June 2017

The Trustees have continued their commitment to make grants to charities that do not enjoy a high profile in order to create significant impact on the work of the charity concerned, and, recognising the day-to-day funding needs of charities, the Trustees continue to consider applications for core costs.

The Trust accepts applications from registered charities whose operational area is within the United Kingdom. The majority of grants are made on a one-off basis although long-term grants are also agreed from time to time for a maximum of three years, particularly in respect of educational establishments mainly in the arts sector, and to help newly created charities to become established.

The vast majority of grants are for between **£500** and **£5,000** although occasionally more is granted.
