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Rosa – Voices from the Frontline

Rosa's Voices from the Frontline Grants Programme is designed to support women's organisations to promote their fight for gender equality in the UK through charitable advocacy work.

The programme offers one-off grants of between £500 and £2,000 and expects that up to 25 projects will be supported in 2017/18. The funding is for charitable advocacy work across Rosa's four pillars of leadership and representation, safety, health and economic justice.

Rosa is looking to support a range of women's voluntary and community organisations, from those who are just beginning to make their voices heard, to those looking to begin to catalyse change at a higher level. Given that the fund aims to address the critical needs of women and girls that miss out most, proposals from organisations that support disadvantaged women and girls, such as the following, are particularly welcomed:

- Homeless
- Refugees and seeking asylum
- LGBT
- BME
- Elderly
- Disabled
- Survivors of gender violence
- From low income backgrounds

The funding can be used to cover costs relating to increasing the skills, capacity and credibility of women who wish to challenge gender inequality and promote awareness and change.

Clarion Housing Group Community Grants Programme – Deadline: 19th May 2017

Clarion Housing Group (formed following the merger in 2016 of Affinity Sutton Group Limited and Circle Housing Group) is the largest housing group in the country and one of its biggest housebuilders. Through its Community Grants Programme - managed by Groundwork - it awards grants of between £1,000 and £5,000 to charities, community organisations and voluntary groups for projects which primarily benefit its residents. The deadline for applications is 19 May 2017 with awards made in July.

The Bright Ideas Fund – Deadline: 31st May 2017

The Community Business Bright Ideas Fund is a £1.85 million, two-year programme, open to community groups, associations and organisations across England which have a good idea for a community business but need help developing it, or which are just starting out. You can apply for up to **£20,000**. The second round is now open.

Foundation Derbyshire – The Derbyshire Older People's Fund

Awards from **£50** to **£5000** - spend period of 1 year

The fund has two key strands:

- To reduce isolation for older people in Derbyshire
- To increase the involvement of older people in the community

The Grants Committee will consider applications quarterly with the first funding round being July 2017. They are open to applications from 1st April and depending on demand can accept bids up to the end of June for that first round. Bupa UK Foundation - 'Healthy Futures' Grants Programme – Deadline: 19th May 2017

Bupa UK Foundation is inviting not-for-profit organisations in the UK to apply for its third funding round, which is focused on young adults aged 18 to 25 years.

The Foundation selects a different theme for each round. The current theme is 'Healthy Futures' which focuses on young adults (18 to 25 years) with specific interest in projects that will have a positive impact on the health and wellbeing of young adults who face ongoing health challenges, supporting and empowering them to live life to the full.

The majority of grants will be for £20,000 or less. A small number of grants may be awarded within the £20,000 to £50,000 range, and occasionally grants of more than £50,000 are awarded. Grant recipients will also receive 15% on top of grant funding awarded as a contribution towards core costs.

For the 'Healthy Futures' programme, the Bupa UK Foundation is looking to fund practical projects that are designed to engage and support people directly.

Projects must take place within the UK, be clearly for public benefit, be delivered within 12 to 18 months and clearly fit the following criteria:

- Supports young people aged 18 to 25 years who face ongoing health challenges.
- Focuses on addressing, supporting or improving health or wellbeing.
- Provides evidence of the specific needs that the project aims to address.
- Explains how those who will benefit from the project will be reached and engaged.
- Includes details of how the health outcomes and impact of the project will be measured.

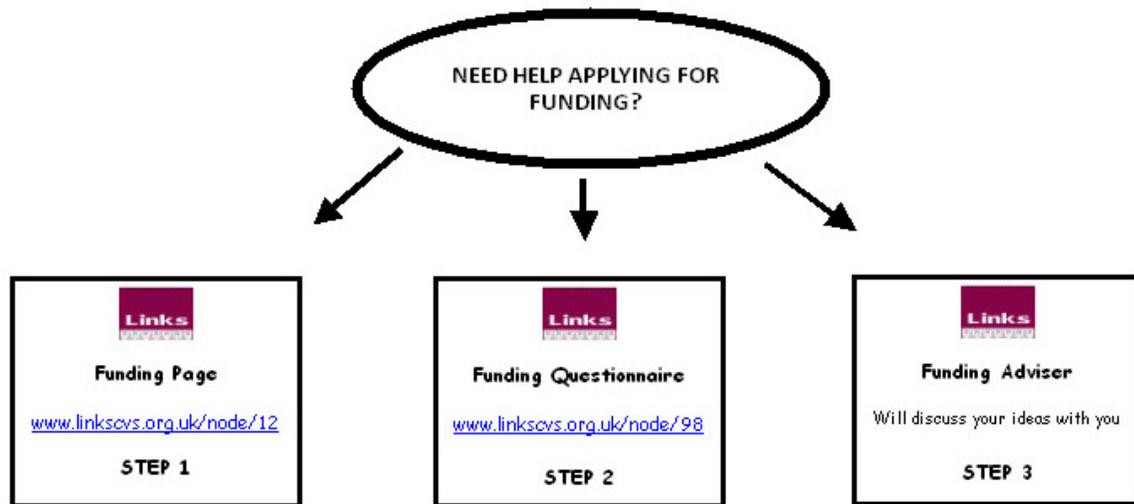
There is a two-stage application process. The deadline for first stage applications is 19 May 2017.
