Funding to Host Events to Support Armed Forces Day 2020 – Deadline: 1st March 2020

The Ministry of Defence is offering grants to groups and organisations across the UK that are planning to host an Armed Forces Day event in their community next summer. Local councils, voluntary and community organisations, schools, ex-service organisations and individuals in the UK can apply for a grant of up to £10,000 (providing the grant funding accounts for no more than 50% of the project costs).

The funding can be used to pay for:

- Road closures required to hold an event, including to allow for parades and marches
- Decorations, flags and banners
- Newspaper and radio advertisements to promote the event
- Marshalling, security and first aid arrangements for the event
- Insurance
- PA and communications systems

The first step is to register an event on the Armed Forces Day website. This will enable groups to access details

on how to apply for the funding.

One Stop - Carriers for Causes - Updated

Money raised from the 5p carrier bag charge at One Stop stores is being used for a new grant programme 'Carriers for Causes' for local community projects. Grants of up to **£500** are available to non-profit organisations and other groups including clubs, schools, parish / town councils, local authorities, housing organisations, CICs etc...

Applicant projects must be within two miles of a One Stop store and demonstrate community need. One Stop stores can be found in locations across Derbyshire including Buxton, Chesterfield, Denby, Derby, Eckington, Heanor, Ilkeston, Matlock, Swadlincote etc... Hilden Charitable Fund – Deadline: 18th March 2020

Grants are available to UK charities working in the areas of homelessness, asylum seekers and refugees, community based initiatives for disadvantaged young people (16-25), penal affairs, and overseas development. Although there are no set funding limits, the average grant is **£5,000**, and Hilden will consider funding projects for more than one year.

Summer Play Scheme – Deadline: 29th May 2020

The Fund has allocated a small budget to help community groups run summer play schemes for disadvantaged communities. Some priority will be given to projects which show they are inclusive of children from refugee families, and show BME involvement.

Trustees look to fund:

- Projects for children aged 5 to 18 years
- Locally based schemes lasting from 2 to 6 weeks
- Schemes with strong volunteer support

Applications are accepted from voluntary agencies with an income of less than £150,000.

Trustees will accept applications from across the UK.

Peter Cruddas Foundation – Deadline: 1st March 2020

The Foundation gives priority to programmes designed to help disadvantaged and disengaged young people in the age range of 14 to 30, to pursue pathways to Education, Training and Employment with the ultimate aim of helping them to become financially independent.

Preference will be given to the support of projects undertaken by UK registered charitable organisations in England and Wales only, for the benefit of such people.

- Pathways/support for young disadvantaged or disengaged people in the age range 16 to 30 into education, training or employment
- Work experience/skills projects for young people aged 16 to 30

Smallwood Trust - Women First Fund

Seed funding is available to charities, social enterprises and other not-for-profit organisations to support projects which enable women on low incomes to access new skills, training, confidence building and employment opportunities. The three main streams they give grants for are:

- Funding for frontline services for women
- Funding for organisations to provide grants to individual women as Smallwood's Community Grant Partners
- Funding for strategic initiatives

Grants are for one year but successful projects may have the opportunity to subsequently apply for replication funding or Smallwood Trust continuation funding.

Blue Spark Foundation

BlueSpark provides funding for projects which aim to improve the education and development of children and young people by means of educational, cultural, sporting or other activities. BlueSpark provides funds for relatively small-scale projects which might not happen at all or would only happen on a smaller scale without the support of BlueSpark. Many of the grants they make are under **£2000** and almost all are under **£5000**. Schools, community groups, clubs and other not for profit organisations are able to apply.
