Veolia Environmental Trust

Not-for-profit organisations can apply now for funding for environmental or community-based projects that are located within five miles of an operating Veolia site in England and starting from late September 2020. The Trust provides grant funding for community and environmental projects in England through the Landfill Communities Fund, using money provided by Veolia.

Grants of between **£10,000** and **£75,000** are available for capital improvement projects at a single site with discrete start and end dates. The maximum project cost should be less than £250,000 (including VAT and professional costs). Match funding of at least 10% of the total project costs is required. Successful applicants will need to pay 10% of the awarded amount to the landfill operator from a third party contributor. The funding is for constituted not-for-profit organisations with a bank account that have a project that addresses at least one of the following categories:

- Community buildings and rooms, including community centres, village halls, community spaces within religious buildings, and Scout or Girl Guiding buildings.
- Outdoor Spaces, including public parks, nature reserves, community gardens, footpaths, bridleways and cycle-paths.
- Play and recreation, including play areas, skateparks, Multi Use Games Areas, sports grounds, pavilions and changing rooms.
- Biodiversity projects - applications from registered Environmental Bodies with projects that meet ENTRUST requirements

Comic Relief's Community Fund

Grassroots community organisations and charities with an income of less than £250,000 per annum can apply now for funding to support projects that tackle at least one of Comic Relief's strategic themes which include:

- **Children Survive & Thrive**
- **Mental Health Matters**

Two types of grants are available: Capacity building grants of up to **£500** and project delivery grants of up to **£4,000**. The Comic Relief Community Fund should be the main funding source for your project.

The Triangle Trust 1949 Fund – Deadline: 4th May 2020

The Triangle Trust provides funding through its Development Grants programme twice a year to registered charities, not-for-profit social enterprises and community interest companies in the UK whose primary purpose is to support unpaid carers and the rehabilitation of offenders or ex-offenders.

Development Grants provide funds towards any costs incurred by the applicant in undertaking its core business so that sustainable income sources can be developed and the organisation's income will not be reduced when the grant comes to an end. Grants are available from **£10,000** up to **£80,000** for a duration of 6 months to 3 years.

Hilden Charitable Fund – Summer Play Schemes 2020 Open Now

The Fund has allocated a small budget to help community groups run summer play schemes for disadvantaged communities. Some priority will be given to projects which show they are inclusive of children from refugee families, and show BME involvement.

Trustees look to fund:

- Projects for children aged 5 to 18 years
- Locally based schemes lasting from 2 to 6 weeks
- Schemes with strong volunteer support

Applications are accepted from voluntary agencies with an income of less than £150,000.

Trustees will accept applications from across the UK.

Trustees WILL NOT SUPPORT:

- Play schemes with a budget of over £12,000
- Club or family holidays
- Day care costs
- Agencies with an income of over £150,000.

Power to Change - Bright Ideas Fund – Deadline: 7th April 2020

Community groups in England looking to set up and start running a community business and who need some help developing it can apply from 26 February for tailored support and grants. Groups accepted onto the programme will receive tailored business development support, mentoring and visits and can apply for a grant of up to **£15,000** to fund development and start-up costs.

To be eligible, the community business needs to be new, locally rooted, trading for the benefit of the local community, accountable to the local community, and have a broad community impact.

Wallace and Gromit Children's Charity

The Wallace and Gromit Children's Charity offers grants to registered charities in the UK working to improve the quality of life for children in hospitals and hospices.

The Charity aims to fund projects which are not funded directly by the NHS. This could be, for example, arts, play and music programmes for patients, facilities for parents such as parent accommodation, a wide range of projects in children's hospices, capital building programmes for children's hospitals and hospices and state of the art equipment. Grants tend to range from **£100** to **£10,000**.
