Face-to-Face Workshops in Portsmouth (24th April) and Bristol (25th April)



The Gas Safe Charity is working in partnership with Wales & West Utilities and SGN to deliver two face-to- face workshops in their respective areas (Bristol and Portsmouth). The focus is mostly on carbon monoxide (sources, signs and symptoms, how to help prevent it etc...), but the workshops will also have input from the Gas Distribution Networks and local partner organisations, in

NEW Gypsy and Traveller's Zoom Workshop

We were delighted to run a Think CO Zoom workshop for workers who support Gypsy and Traveller communities. We realised our training had



not reached these communities, so we made contact with the Friends, Families and Travellers' Charity. They are based in Brighton and from there, they were able to share the workshop details with a national network of, mostly, local authority staff who work closely with these communities. The workshop took place in mid-January, with just over 25 people participating. The attendees highlighted the risks associated with LPG gas, the need to inform landlords of their responsibilities to provide CO detectors when providing accommodation on their land. The plan is to run another of these Zoom workshops later in the year.



Zoom Offer

We have run or are planning to run Zoom Think CO workshops for specific organisations including the National Energy Foundation, National Energy Action, Derbyshire Citizen's Advice and Kent County Council. The workshops are for your staff/volunteers only or partners you work with. If this would be of interest for your organisation, let us know. Better Housing Better Health (BHBH) Webinars

Think CO is working with National Energy Foundation (NEF) Better Housing Better Health project to run monthly webinars on the topic of the "Energy Crisis and CO Awareness."



The webinar will introduce participants to the BHBH service and help them to identify signs of fuel poverty amongst any residents they are working with, and also raise carbon monoxide awareness.





The webinars will last about 90 minutes, are free to attend. The next webinar is on Wednesday 24th March at 2.00pm and the April "webinar" will be an in-person presentation as part of the Think CO face-to-face workshop in Portsmouth on 24th April (see above). NGN Research

Recent research from the Gas
Distribution Network NGN (NGN
Research in Cumbria) has highlighted
the fact that there has been a 61%
increase in actual and suspected CO
incidents in Cumbria since 2021. This
translates into 600 responses to
households in the county.



NGN believe that behind this alarming


increase are the financial pressures of the ongoing cost-of-living crisis, pushing the essential safety measures of CO alarms and appliance maintenance to the backburner for many households. Examples include a serious incident with a gas barbeque, as well as diesel generators being used during power cuts.

Grants for Individuals The Think CO

Programme is often asked about where you can get grants for people in need. One of the resources we suggest is "The Guide to Grants for Individuals in Need" produced by the Directory of Social Change (DSC).

It's aimed at helping you support individuals and families in emergency financial help. It has details of 1,800 grant making trusts and charities which give away £376 million a year. The 19th edition of the guide is now available to buy. To find out more about the guide and how to buy it click

It's pricey at £110, so you may want to find out of your local authority has a copy you can access or your local Council for Voluntary Services (CVS).

All Party Parliamentary Carbon Monoxide Group (APPCOG)



Legislation: Renters Reform Bill - APPCOG parliamentarians are reviewing the Renters Reform Bill with a view to strengthening provisions on health and safety standards, including protection against carbon monoxide poisoning. The Bill remains under scrutiny in the House of Commons.

Decent Homes Standard update - Updates to the Decent Homes Standard are expected to be published in the current winter session of Parliament. The updates will alter provisions of the standard applying

to social housing, and through the Renters Reform Bill, will extend the standards to the private rented sector. The Decent Homes Standard sets minimum standards for the condition of homes and is currently only applicable to social housing.

Think CO presented at "Delivering CO and Indoor Air Quality" Policy Connect roundtable - Policy Connect has shared recommendations from the December 2023 "Delivering CO and Indoor Air Safety" roundtable to inform the next government's work on CO protection and prioritising issues of CO poisoning in housing and health policy. The outcomes have also been shared with the Cross-Government Working Group on Gas Safety and Carbon Monoxide Awareness to inform the Government's support for frontline services in protecting CO safety.
