We offer apprenticeships that are designed in collaboration with employers to ensure that they grow a more skilled workforce, whether for existing staff or new recruits.

We can support employers through the entire recruitment process so that they are sure to match the apprentice with the roles needed within the workforce. This includes help advertising vacancies and help with shortlisting and interviews.

All apprentices are visited in the workplace and are fully supported throughout their apprenticeship journey. Employers are also provided with ongoing assistance to ensure their apprentice is progressing and on track to complete their training.

We are a large provider for Derbyshire County Council's apprenticeship offer and are proud of the high success of apprentices securing permanent roles and promotions within the council.

If you have an apprentice aged 16 to 21, the apprenticeship is fully funded. At age 22+, the employer contributes 5%, or DACES can support you in applying for a levy transfer from Derbyshire County Council.
