1.	Welcome, introductions and apologies

2.	Sarah Lowe – Derbyshire Federation for Mental Health	
	Unfortunately Sarah was unable to attend this meeting, so we will see her at a future meeting.	
3.	Lesley Winnard – Workpays Chesterfield	
	Workpays have funding from UKSPF (which ends in March) to work with people from aged16+, to offer work readiness support and training. The centre is on Newbold Road (next to the old Scarsdale hospital), open 10am to 4pm. On Tuesdays they work with NEETS (16-24). The programme is for eight weeks, with a follow up and possible referring on to another service at	

the end so support continues. The scheme is called 'Back on Track'. Other funded support includes 'The Multiply', set up to help with numeracy skills for anyone who is working or unemployed aged 19+. Training is also provided for digital skills, digital online awareness, work practical/preparation, fire safety, manual handling and food safety. These sessions can be delivered in the community to groups. They also have adult courses for literacy and maths. Workpays will be working with Gullivers Kingdom, to help with their recruitment in February offering a Customer Service Level 1. They can also help other businesses who are wanting to recruit.

### 4. Karen Sheriff - Building Bridges

Building Bridges started from an idea in 2023, from Karen's own personal experience of being isolated through illness. In March 2024, the first meeting at Chesterfield Library took place. Meetings are relaxed, non-judgemental and in a space where people are made welcome. The group sessions are led by what the attendees want to talk about. Building Bridges receive some small grants to facilitate running costs. By August 2024 Building Bridges was a constituted support group. A fundraiser last year raised £500, and they will be doing another in May 2025. The key focus is on supporting people with disabilities and accessibility requirements; bringing people out of isolation and who are feeling lonely. The group gets involved in campaigns and their ethos is to use positive language. Derbyshire Law Centre are doing some work with network rail, re accessibility and Karen is going to go along as a volunteer to advise. Building Bridges have a website; www.buildingbridgesinthecommunity.org and they are also on Facebook. They meet every other Tuesday, 12:30pm-1:30pm at the Library in Chesterfield. The next meeting is 21st January 2025.

Funding from DCC comes to an end at the end of March 2025. They will have to become a charging service for the future, but not sure how this will work yet.
