Music for All - Music in the Community – Deadline: 1st February 2019

The Music in the Community grants programme is administered by Music for All, which is the charity of the UK musical instrument industry, and is also supported by the NAMM Foundation in the US and endorsed by a number of musical celebrities. Grants are typically around **£2,500**.

The grants programme is intended to act as a helping hand to projects and initiatives across the UK that seek to bring music to their community. The funding is aimed at groups that need assistance to fulfil their potential in developing truly sustainable music programmes.

Funding is available for musical instrument costs, using music to break down barriers, providing a variety of educational opportunities as well as helping to find ways to integrate many diverse and minority groups positively into society.

People's Postcode Trust - Small Projects Grants Programme – Open between 6th– 20th February 2019

Short-term, designated funding is available for projects which focus on the improving community health & wellbeing, arts & physical recreation and reducing isolation.

The following funding levels apply to specific applicants:

- Applicants that are not formally registered as a charity with OSCR/Charity Commission can apply for up to **£2,000** in funding.
- Applicants that are registered with OSCR / Charity Commission and can provide a charity number can apply for between **£500** and **£20,000** in funding.

Warburton's Trust - Community Grants – Deadline: 16th February 2019

Small grants are available for local projects, activities and organisations that have charitable aims and that will be of real direct benefit to families in England, Scotland and Wales. Community grants of up to and including **£250** are available. Funding is available for projects that focus on supporting families that need the most help and are in line with the following social themes:

- Challenges:
 - Health - help families lead healthier lifestyles.
 - Financial stability - help families manage their finances.
 - Worklessness - help families recognise the economic and social benefits of employment.
- Opportunities:
 - Health education - help educate families about healthy lifestyles (no Project Grants).
 - Aspiration - help raise career aspirations to improve prospects for them and their families.
 - Employability and skills - help raise employment prospects for family members seeking employment.

Community grants can be used for something specific that will benefit the cause the organisation supports, such as buying equipment or supporting a community day.

Erasmus+ Programme – The European Commission - Deadline: 5th February 2019

Erasmus+ is the EU Programme in the fields of education, training, youth and sport for the period 2014-2021 . Education, training, youth and sport can make a major contribution to help tackle socio-economic changes, the key challenges that Europe will be facing until the end of the decade and to support the implementation of the European policy agenda for growth, jobs, equity and social inclusion.

The [joint report on progress during phase 1 of negotiations](#) between the UK and the EU states that 'following withdrawal from the Union, the UK will continue to participate in the Union programmes financed by the Multiannual Financial Framework (MFF) 2014-2020 until their closure'. Erasmus+ is one such programme and under the terms of the Withdrawal Agreement UK organisation's eligibility to apply for Erasmus+ funds during this period will remain unchanged for the duration of projects under the current programme. On this basis, the UK Government encourages UK organisations to continue to bid for Erasmus+ funding.
