The MSE Charity

The MSE Charity are currently running two grant rounds. Each round focuses on delivering financial life skills to different defined groups.

The next grant round opening on Monday 4th February is:

- Raising the Next Generation – Children, youth and families.

As the Charity's resources are modest, the Trustees prefer to fund small to medium-sized non-profit organisations with a constitution for example registered Charities, CICs, Credit Unions, excluding statutory organisations. Organisations should have an income under £500,000 and have less than six months free reserves. You can apply for up to **£5,000**.

Clarion Housing Group Community Grants Programme – Deadline: 8th February 2019

Clarion Housing Group is the largest housing group in the country and one of its biggest housebuilders. Through its Community Grants Programme - managed by Groundwork - it awards grants of between **£1,000** and **£5,000** to charities, community organisations and voluntary groups for projects which primarily benefit its residents.

Armed Forces Covenant Fund – Veterans' Community Centres - First Deadline: 11th March 2019

The Armed Forces Covenant Fund Trust is inviting applications to its new £3 million funding programme to fund renovations and improvements to veterans' community centres across the UK.

This is a specialist pot of money and applications will only be accepted from Armed Forces organisations that are registered charities or community interest companies (CIC). There will be three funding rounds.

Applications for grants of up to **£30,000** can be made during each round whereas larger grants for up to **£150,000** can only be made in the third round.

These larger grants are for more complex projects, and it is mandatory that applicants discuss their project with the funder.

WHSmith Trust Community Grants

The WHSmith Trust is an independent registered charity that aims to support good causes in the local communities where WHSmith operates, and also to promote literacy and a love of reading. Each year the Trust supports employees by matching their fundraising and volunteering for charities and schools. The Trust also makes donations to hundreds of schools across the UK and funds large scale literacy projects through its long-standing partnership with the National Literacy Trust.

The WHSmith Trust offers grants of up to **£500** to voluntary organisations and schools from the proceeds of the compulsory carrier bag levies across the UK. Grants are awarded every six months to charities, schools and community groups of any size, provided they support the community in the UK.

The Allen Lane Foundation

The Allen Lane Foundation fund small registered charities, voluntary groups and charitable organisations. We fund particular beneficiary groups – currently these are:

- Asylum seekers and refugees
- Gypsies and Travellers
- LGBTQ communities
- Migrant communities
- Offenders and ex-offenders
- Older people
- People experiencing mental health problems
- People experiencing violence or abuse

The Prince's Countryside Fund – Deadline: 21st February 2019

The Prince's Countryside Fund has been established to support the sustainability and protection of farms and rural communities throughout the UK. The Fund aims to have a long-term positive impact on rural communities, helping those that live and work there sustain the countryside by tackling key rural issues.

Grants of up to a maximum of **£50,000** (inclusive of VAT) to a maximum period of three years.

The Fund can pay for a portion or the entirety of the costs of a project, as either a one-off grant or as ongoing support.

The grant programme currently aims to tackle the following key rural issues:

- To improve the prospects of viability for family farm businesses.
- To sustain rural communities and drive economic vibrancy.
- To support aid delivery in emergency and building resilience.
