Tech for Good – Comic Relief and Paul Hamlyn Foundation – Opens on: 11th February 2019

After co-funding two rounds of Tech for Good in 2017 and 2018, Comic Relief and the Paul Hamlyn Foundation have joined forces again to continue running the programme for another three years (to 2021) and will be providing a total of £2.4 million in funding.

The first round is expected to provide grants and other support for up to 13 not-for-profit organisations to develop or scale up digital products or services.

Projects should address one of Comic Relief's four core issue areas, which are:

- Children Survive and Thrive.
- Global Mental Health Matters.
- Fighting for Gender Justice.
- A Safe Place to Be.

Comic Relief says that it would also welcome applications addressing challenges related to disability and inclusion outside of these four core areas.

Austin and Hope Pilkington Trust – Deadline: 28th February 2019

Grants are available to UK registered charities for projects that address specific categories set out by the Trust each year. The 2019 theme is Children and Young People. In 2019, priority is given to projects focusing on:

- child exploitation
- mentoring and support
- clubs and activities

They are prioritising awarding grants to projects that address mental health.

Organisations registered with the Charity Commission (England, Wales and Northern Ireland) or OSCR, or exempt from registration, can apply.

The charity's income level determines what level of funding they can apply for:

- Charities with an income of between £100,000 and £1 million can apply for a grant of **£1,000**.
- Charities with an income of £1 million and above can apply for a grant of **£5,000**.

Help the Homeless – Deadline: 15th December

Help The Homeless's main funding remit is the regular allocation of grants (generally up to **£5,000**) for capital costs to small and medium-sized registered charities only (those with a turnover of under £1m per annum).

The Hospital Saturday Fund – Deadline: 10th September 2018

One off grants up to **£10,000** from The Hospital Saturday Fund whose aims are to provide assistance through its charitable funds for registered health charities such as hospitals, hospices, medical organisations who are in need of grants for medical projects, care, research or support of medical training.

Blue Spark Foundation

BlueSpark provides funding for projects which aim to improve the education and development of children and young people by means of educational, cultural, sporting or other activities. BlueSpark provides funds for relatively small-scale projects which might not happen at all or would only happen on a smaller scale without the support of BlueSpark. Many of the grants they make are under **£2000** and almost all are under **£5000**. Schools, community groups, clubs and other not for profit organisations are able to apply.

Community Action Grant - Police and Crime Commissioner for Derbyshire – Deadline: 1st March 2019

Grants are available to enable communities in Derbyshire to deliver the priorities of the Police and Crime Plan at a local level to reduce crime and anti-social behaviour, protect victims and vulnerable people and support witnesses.

He has invited community groups, non-profit making organisations and third sector organisations to work with him to deliver his priorities at a local level.

Large grants of between **£2,501** and **£25,000** will be available once during any one financial year while smaller grants of up to **£2,500** will be allocated three times per year. All successful grants will run for a maximum 12-month period.
