## Sport England – Community Asset Fund

- Bids from **£1,000** to **£150,000**
- **£1,000** to **£15,000** for small scale project which will address emergency work
- **£15,000** to **£50,000** for projects which address more substantial changes
- **£50,000** to **£150,000**, by exception for larger investments. Applicants will need to demonstrate a considerable impact or are targeting underrepresented groups.
- Statutory organisations and schools will need to provide at least £1:£1 match funding.

## The Derbyshire Environmental Trust – Deadline: 8<sup>th</sup> September 2017

The Derbyshire Environmental Trust (DET) is running its own funding scheme aiming to distribute around £30,000 per annum, with a preference for funding either one larger project, or a number of medium sized ones, rather than a lot of small schemes. Here are some key aspects regarding the fund:

- Projects must be located within the county of Derbyshire and within 10 miles of a licensed landfill site (DET staff can check this on request if potential applicants provide a postcode for the project site).
- Minimum grant request of **£5,000**, maximum of **£30,000**.
- Projects do not have to have match funding and there is no upper limit on the total project cost, where applications require match funding this must be in place / confirmed no later than 31 October 2017.
- Projects must not have started.
- School related projects, car parks, allotments, purchase of vehicles and footpaths adjacent to roads are not eligible.

Examples of the type of project that would be eligible include the provision, maintenance and repair of: children's play areas, skate parks, Multi Use Games Areas, sports fields and other recreational facilities, nature reserves, footpaths/bridleways, community centres/village halls. Last year the DET awarded £10k to Heage Village Hall for a project to build an extension housing much needed new toilets and £20,000 to Glapwell Parish Council towards replacement children's play equipment.

### **Homeless Link - Social Investment Fund**

Homeless Link will invest £4.5 million over the next three years, offering unsecured loans of between £25,000 and £150,000 to homelessness organisations. It is expected that the first round which opens on 19 June at an event in London will finance five projects.

The aim of the fund is to test and learn where social investment can be most effectively used alongside other forms of funding to improve outcomes. It is looking to support organisations to:

- Increase the homelessness sector's knowledge and experience of social investment.
- Develop new models for income generation and funding.
- Improve their long-term sustainability.

According to Homeless Link, 'the programme is the first of its kind exclusively for the homelessness sector and one of very few sector-specific funds in existence

### **Greggs Foundation Environmental Grants Fund – Deadline: 24<sup>th</sup> June**

The Greggs Foundation is currently accepting applications from not-for-profit organisations and schools in Great Britain that are seeking funding for an environmental project.

The Greggs Foundation uses the money raised from the 5p levy on carrier bag sales in Greggs shops to provide grants to small not-for-profit organisations and schools in Great Britain for projects that make a difference to local areas.

The grants of up to **£2,000** are aimed at projects which make a difference to local areas across Great Britain, with preference given to projects which include one or more of the following:

- Improves the local environment.
- Insures involvement of local communities.
- Delivers a sustainable and measurable difference.
- Supports people in need.

Grants can cover the purchase of equipment, sessional salary costs, purchase of trees/plants, small capital projects and learning activities.

Preference will be given to small, locally based and community led organisations with an annual income of less than £300,000 a year. Priority will be given to organisations that are based near a Greggs shop.

## **Lloyds Bank Foundation's Invest Programme – Deadline: 16<sup>th</sup> June**

The Foundation provides funding to charities and charitable incorporated organisations (CIOs) in England and Wales through the following two programmes:

- Invest - a flexible, long-term core funding programme for charities delivering clear, targeted outcomes for disadvantaged people. These grants are from **£10,000** up to a maximum of **£25,000** per year for two or three years, with the opportunity for continuation funding for a further period - up to six years in total.
- Enable - a smaller and shorter grants programme for charities that have identified clear development needs. This funding aims to help the organisations deliver their mission more effectively. These grants are up to a total **£15,000** over two years. The Enable grant programme now accepts applications on an ongoing basis. There are no deadlines.

The Invest programme welcomes applications from charities that are registered with the Charity Commission, with an income of between £25,000 and £1 million, and operate mainly in England and Wales.

The grants are to be used for core organisational costs which are related to the day to day running of the charity. Consideration will only be given to requests for core costs where over 50% of the charity's work and expenditure meets the Foundation's criteria. Funding is also available for costs associated with the direct delivery of the charity's work.

Core costs include things like building running costs, rent, utilities, management costs, part-funding or funding of salaries, etc.

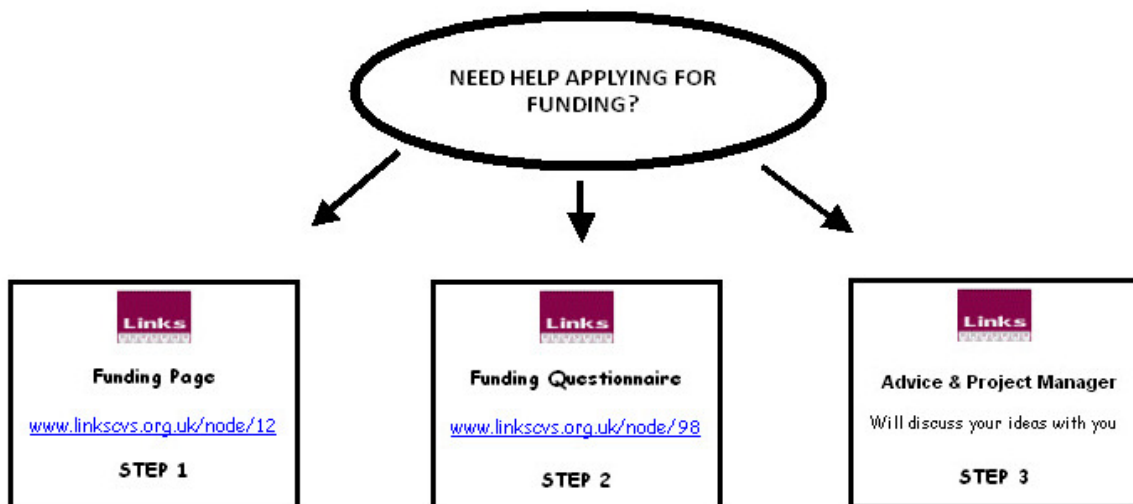
