Foundation Derbyshire Rolls-Royce Fund 2019

For the last three years, the Foundation Derbyshire Rolls-Royce Fund has targeted its grant making towards different aspects of mental health services for young people. The Fund has recognised national concerns and has echoed the dialogue around the insufficient levels of care available. The 2019 theme will be Mental Health Support in Schools. Grants of up to **£8000** for any constituted Parent and Teacher Association or a similar organisation (friends of etc.). If you are not sure you are / have a constituted body then please do call Foundation Derbyshire for advice.

They are looking to fund programmes and activities that focus on resilience, mindfulness, strategies for spotting and tackling mental health issues, exercise and techniques for better mental health.

Greggs – Local Community Projects Fund – Opens on 1st December 2018

Grants of up to **£2000** are made to eligible charitable organisations that work in local areas that have a Greggs' bakery (nearest are Chesterfield and Whittington Moor).

The Foundation are looking for application that "make a difference to the lives of people in need in the heart of Greggs' local communities". All projects must support a community of interest, ie people who are:

- Disabled or suffering chronic illness
- Living in poverty
- Voluntary carers
- Homeless people
- Isolated older people
- Other demonstrable significant need

Masonic Charitable Foundation Grants – Deadline: 2nd January 2019

Early Years Opportunities Grants Programme

Grants are available for charities in England and Wales that support disadvantaged and vulnerable children and young people (up the age of 25 years) to overcome the barriers they face in order to achieve the best possible start in life.

There are two funding levels:

- Large grants of between **£10,000** and **£150,000** for up to three years are available to charities with an income exceeding £500,000. The average large grant will range from **£20,000** to **£80,000**. Occasionally, large grants of up to **£150,000** are made for outstanding projects.
- Small grants of between **£500** and **£15,000** are available to charities with an income of under **£500,000**.

All grants can be over one, two, or three years.

Later Life Inclusions Grants Programme

Grants for local and national charities in England and Wales that are working to reduce loneliness and isolation in later life.

There are two funding levels:

- Large grants starting from **£10,000** are available to charities with an annual income exceeding £500,000. The average large grant will range from **£20,000** to **£80,000**.

Occasionally, large grants of up to **£200,000** are made for outstanding projects.

- Small grants of between **£500** and **£15,000** are available to charities with an income of under £500,000.

All grants can be over one, two, or three years.

Reminder: Grow Wild – Community Project Funding – Deadline: 10th December 2018

Grow Wild is awarding funding of **£2,000** or **£4,000** to groups and projects that:

- Stand out from the crowd - think something creative, or even better something that hasn't been done before!
- Focus on UK native wildflowers, plants and/or fungi, highlighting the importance of these species for the environment, and for quality of life.
- Will encourage large scale community involvement, ideally in the hundreds!
- Will deliver the project in a space or location that is accessible to the general public i.e. is not in a restricted or controlled area

Will engage one or more of these groups:

- Young people aged 12-18
- Students and young people aged 18-25
- People living in urban areas
- People experiencing hardship and reduced access to services
- Adults that are less engaged with their community and environmental activities

The Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government (MHCLG) – Windrush Day Grant Fund – Deadline: 21st January 2018

The Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government (MHCLG) have launched the £500,000 Windrush Day Grant Fund for communities across the country to hold local events, such as exhibitions seminars, school projects and street parties, to celebrate the contribution of the Windrush Generation on Windrush Day, which takes place annually on 22 June, and throughout the year.

The Government is seeking innovative approaches, founded on active community engagement. It will fund projects and events that support the high-level objectives of the Windrush Day Grant, which are to celebrate, commemorate, educate, and must be community led and sustainable, and local, national and intergenerational in scope. Grants of between **£2,500** and **£25,000** will be available.
